The San Gorgonio Pass Republican Women were pleased to present Shannon Coley the scholarship for 2009. This scholarship, in the amount of

\$500 is awarded to a deserving Republican woman who is trying to better herself through education. Shannon Coley is enrolled in the 18 month Licensed Vocational Nurse program at Beaumont Adult School and will graduate in April 2010. She is a full-time student and has a grade point average of 4.0. Her goal is to provide financial independence for herself and her sons, 9 and 11 years of age. The Project Uplift Scholarship began in 2004 with awards to deserving women in both the Banning and Beaumont Adult Education Schools. Since that time, \$3,500 has been given 8 times to 6 recipients who are striving to better themselves through education.

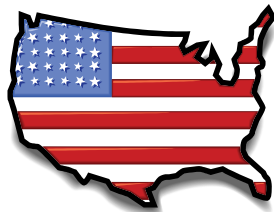

the Obamanites are all in accord, as almost every patsy on NBC will have you believe? Your common sense tells you otherwise.

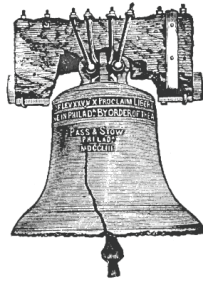

ADVOCACY REPORT – May 4-5 2009

Those attending from Riverside: Mary Helen Kelly, Christine Watson, Jeanne Brennan, Elaine Henderson, Adele Harrison, Julie Gilbert, student and Jack.

150 students with one school denying their students to attend (17). 150 CRFW members and Shirley Sadler NFRW Sue Lynch V.P. NFRW and running for NFRW President in 2010.

Monday was CFRW Board of Directors meeting with NFRW President and Vice President speaking along with business session. Tuesday was Lobby Day and students meeting with legislators.

Jean Fuller 32nd assembly said that farmers are being denied water for their crops due to the Delta Smelt being “endangered”.

Doug LaMalfa spoke on how to lobby and described for the students how a bill becomes law.

We heard from Paul Cook whose bill to restrict child predators from having ice cream truck business just passed after one year of being looked at by a Democratic committee. Paul hadn't realized that he could get his 3rd Purple Heart for serving in Sacramento!

Tom Del Becarro is chairing a petition drive for: Save the 1st Amendment (Free Speech for broadcasters) and Save the Vote to require picture ID to vote. When you see a petition for these 2 drives, be sure and sign and then VOTE!!! His memorable quote “common frigin’ sense is that the more it costs, the less you (taxpayer) get”. Tom will be running for Chair of California Republican Party convention in LaQuinta on September 25-27. Save these dates.



Senator Dennis Hollingsworth on holding firm on no more taxes, fees and keep the Jarvis and 2/3 majority to raise taxes. They will be coming after the voters and will be putting forth initiatives that are so muddy you have no idea what it means. We need to back our Republican leaders that don't cave.

Other Assembly members from around the state: Audra Strickland, Jim Nielsen, Danny Gilmore and Dan Logue all gave their perspective.

The Hyatt Regency is very impressive having just completed a top to bottom renovation. The weather was fair and food was quite good.

We should all be proud of CFRW for continuing to support (through the Ambassador Program) this very important contribution to our governing body. We are proud of our Legislative analyst volunteers.

I heartily endorse more lobbying efforts by our members.

IMMIGRATION

Anti immigration activists have to gear up to counter increased efforts from immigration supporters who are seriously attempting to pass a comprehensive immigration reform bill that will stress amnesty for 12-20 million illegal immigrants in the U.S.

There are strong indications that the Democrats feel this is the time that they will succeed.

President Obama talks from both sides of his mouth. While indicating that he will strengthen our borders, he is also keen on passing a com-

prehensive immigration reform bill with amnesty as a prime objective. Post amnesty immigration after the 1986 Immigration Reform and Control Act jumped sky high to its current millions annually. In Congress, the De-

mocrats continually pander to the Latino/Mexican lobbying interests by weakening tools that have strengthened immigration enforcement. Because of Harry Reid's stalling and blocking tactics, E-Verify won an extension only until September 2009. Section 287(g), which trains and helps local enforcement to cooperate with ICE in apprehending illegal aliens, has funding problems and will mostly be used to apply to criminal elements only. ICE's efficiency is strapped. Nancy Pelosi has been on the rampage, vehemently criticizing ICE agents' raids and calling illegal aliens "patriots". 28 workers arrested at Yamato Engine Specialists in Washington state were released and given temporary work permits, instead of being processed and deported. In California, Senate Bill 125 (Sen. John Benoit, Bermuda Dunes) which would have the state bill the federal government for the full cost of incarceration of illegal alien criminals, did not pass the Public



Safety Committee. 15 percent of California's prison population consists of illegal aliens (25,728 in 2008) costing Californian roughly \$900 million, and not to pass the bill beats all rational thinking! Now with Arlen Specter turning Democrat and Al Franken almost winning Minnesota, the liberal Senate will have their two thirds majority to pass anything they want unhindered. The Senate Judiciary headed by Senator Charles Schumer had a hearing entitled "Comprehensive Immigration Reform in 2009 Can We Do It and How?" on April 30, packed with business, ethnic and pro-immigration group witnesses. All is not well for us.

And yet – all is not lost. The borders are particularly vulnerable, with continuing drugs and people-smuggling and vicious drug wars, and now the swine flu. The Washington ABC Poll recently revealed that 74 percent of Americans think

the U.S. is not doing enough to prevent illegal aliens from crossing the borders, and a Harris Poll commissioned by the Federation for American Immigration Reform showed Americans opposed to illegal immigration amnesty by a 60 to 29 percent margin. Most likely the margin is greater now due to the weakened economy, an unemployment rate of 8.5 percent (11.2 percent in California), approximately 13.2 million jobless who would benefit with more jobs available to American workers, massive government deficits and continuing benefits for illegal aliens, and the nightmare of trillions of dollars more in indebtedness for generations to come.

Just as we had stopped the Comprehensive Immigration Reform bill in the past by uniting and flooding Congress with our protest calls and shutting off the switchboard, we can remain vigilant and send a vigorous message to Congress and the White House that they are out of step with American voters and our national interest.

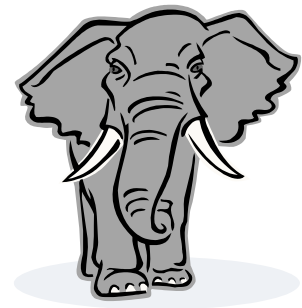
