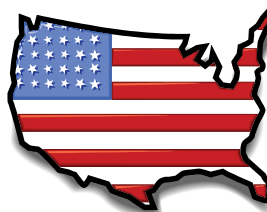

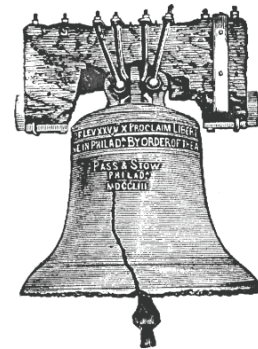

It is time to get ready for our state elections. Our state economy has been ailing for some time, and it is time to look around for those Republican legislators who need support if they are going to be able to put together legislative packages to correct a failing state economy while not taking from the city's coffers. What can we do as members of the Federation to help our State of California?

- Look for candidates with personal integrity who will represent our Republican principles. Support them with your time and money.
- Spend money for speakers regarding the state issues and local city issues for your programs at your club meetings. Have study groups and book clubs.
- Look for candidates for local office. "All politics is local!"
- Run for public office, committees, and commissions. We need women at all levels of U.S. government.
- Apply for state committees and commissions.
- Participate in RNC (Remember that our Federation is a separate entity.)
- Help grow our Federation so there are more people to help with elections.
- Make sure members understand how the Registrar of Voters operates. Take tours.
- Register Republican voters throughout the year.
- Bring new members into our clubs.
- Build your precinct base and know where Republicans live.



Be involved in your county and state central committees.

Stay in touch with the Governor's office in your locality. Include this staff in your group activities and have them as speakers at your meetings. Remember, we are not a tea and cookies organization. We are working clubs with the purpose of educating about Republican points of view on political issues, political campaigns, registering voters, and building our Republican base. It starts in our states and local communities.

Let me know of new ideas that are working for you. Did the Bounty Program work for your club? I salute the county and club presidents with great appreciation for stepping forward as leaders. ## NFRW POINTS FORWARD

### Closer Look at Obama's Budget by Brian Riedl

As we dig into the President's budget, more emerges:

- Remember the President stating his budget "identified \$2 trillion in savings over the next decade?" It actually increases spending by \$1 trillion. But he classifies as "savings" \$1.4 trillion in tax increases (apparently savings for the government, not for you) and \$1.5 trillion "saved" in Iraq relative to a fantasy baseline that otherwise assumes current spending levels forever. The Iraq gimmick is the equivalent of a family deciding to "save" \$10,000 by first assuming an expensive vacation and then not taking it.
- Real federal spending per household - \$24,000 before the recession - would reach \$33,000 per household by 2019. Between 2008 and 2013, the \$5.7 trillion in new debt will come to \$48,000 per household.
- It is easy to "cut the deficit in half" after you've quadrupled it. Furthermore, three upcoming developments - the end of the recession, troop pullout in Iraq, and phase-out of the supposedly-temporary "stimulus" spending - would, by themselves, cut the 2013 budget deficit in half. President Bush was slammed for averaging \$300 billion budget deficits while funding a war. President Obama will be praised for running \$500 billion deficits in 2013 at a time of (assumed) peace and prosperity.
- The President's budget proposed a new PAYGO law - and then violates it by \$3.4 trillion.
- The tax increases are staggering. The President would raise taxes by \$1 trillion on the top 2.5 million tax filers. That comes to \$400,000 per tax filer over ten years. And despite these harsh tax hikes (and a \$646 billion cap-and-trade tax hike), the President's rosy budget assumes a much faster economic recovery than CBO or the Blue Chip Consensus.

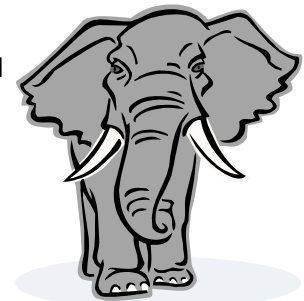
