Capitol Update

SB 48 Signed by Brown

Yesterday Governor Brown signed into law SB 48 (Leno, D-3), legislation that now requires public schools in California to teach "gay history." From Kindergarten through high school, textbooks that do not include the contributions of homosexuals will be prohibited. The Governor ignored the thousands upon thousands of Californians who contacted him, urging him to veto this harmful legislation. Instead Governor Brown succumbed to the Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual and Transgender (LGBT) lobby and signed SB 48 which will cost the state a fortune in new textbooks. What is more appalling than the Governor's negligence of the financial issues of this bill is the blatant disregard for parent's rights. The bill does not include an "opt-out" option for parents or teachers. Senator Leno, Governor Brown and the LGBT are dictating their educational and philosophical ideology to our schools. There is already a backlash from pro-family organizations, with petitions

already in circulation. If you would like to get involved, please email the CFRW Legislative Advocate at advocate@cfrw.org. The CFRW and our members worked very hard in opposing this legislation and your efforts should be applauded. The CFRW Advocacy office received call after call, email after email, from members working to oppose SB 48 by contacting the Governor. You should be proud of your efforts, but now we have to keep up the hard work. The fight for our students and parent's rights is not over, so please remain vigilant and informed! **We need action from our members like this more often and earlier in the legislative process!**

Your Action Is Needed Again!

There are two bills the **CFRW OPPOSES** that are headed for Governor Brown's desk. AB 130 by Assemblyman Cedillo, (D-45) is the California Dream Act, which would give illegal aliens California resident benefits for higher education. AB 130 is bad for California community and state colleges and rewards illegal aliens for breaking our laws. The California Dream Act's complimentary bill AB 131 (Cedillo, D-45) was put in the [Suspense File](#) by the Senate Appropriations Committee. For the CFRW analysis on AB 130, click [here](#).

The next bill we need to defeat is AB 459 (Hill, D-19). AB 459 would abolish the Electoral College for states that agree to pass the National Popular Vote compact. AB 459 gives the presidential candidate that wins the national popular vote all 55 of California's electoral votes. Assemblyman Dan Logue also opposes the legislation, saying "Because most votes are located in urban areas, which tend to be Democratic strongholds, the bill would prompt presidential candidates to focus on large cities at the expense of rural areas where GOP registration is strong." Former Attorney General candidate John Eastman wrote an op-ed explaining the constitutionality issues regarding AB 459 and the National Popular Vote compact. Read his commentary [here](#). We cannot let this Democrat power-grab happen! Bills similar to AB 459 were vetoed in 2006 and 2008. Let's make sure a veto happens again!

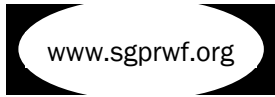
